6	10. Penalty. Notwithstanding Title 17-A, section 4-B, a person who violates a provision of a municipal ordinance adopted
8	under this section commits a <u>Class D</u> crime punishable by the following fines:
10	A. For harvesting shellfish from a closed area er-digging
12	shellfish-without-a-license:
14	(1) For the first offense, a fine of not less than \$300 and not more than \$1,500; and
