12	Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6074, sub-§8, ¶F is enacted to read:
14	F. A teacher who is providing a primary or secondary school program.

20	This bill provides that teachers in primary or secondary schools do not need approval by the Marine Resources Advisory
22	Council but may obtain a special license for research, aquaculture or education directly from the Commissioner of Marine
24	Resources.
