Fiscal Detail and Notes

Repealing the permit requirement for 53-foot trailers will decrease Highway Fund revenue collected by the Secretary of State by \$705,135 and \$940,180 in fiscal years 2003-04 and 2004-05, respectively. Increasing various truck and trailer related fees will increase Highway Fund revenue collected by the Secretary of State by \$709,499 and \$945,998 in fiscal years 2003-04 and 2004-05, respectively. This bill will also result in an undetermined loss of Highway Fund fine revenue due to the anticipated reduction in unregistered trailer violations.
