SUMMARY

This amendment prohibits the use of personal watercraft on Indian Pond and defines "aquarium" for the purposes of importing and possessing nonnative and exotic species. The amendment exempts a person who holds a smelt wholesale license and fishes 6 with a hook and line from certain restrictions regarding the taking and selling of live smelt. The amendment strikes the 8 language from the bill that would allow a deer tag to be issued 10 separately from a big game license. The amendment also clarifies that the State has exclusive jurisdiction over the regulation of 12 all-terrain vehicles. Finally, the amendment establishes a lifetime trapping license and adjusts the cost of combination lifetime licenses to better reflect other fee structures. 14
