
HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1135, L.D. 1549, Bill, "An Act To Fund Municipal Collection of Household Hazardous Waste"

Amend the amendment in section 2 in subsection 6 in the blocked paragraph in the last line (page 2, line 18 in amendment) by inserting after the following: "subsection." the following: 'A container of general use pesticide distributed within this State for use by a commercial agricultural producer or a pesticide applicator certified pursuant to this chapter is exempt from the fee imposed by this subsection.'

Further amend the amendment in section 3 in that part designated "~~\$4873.~~" in subsection 2 in the 2nd line (page 3, line 42 in amendment) by striking out the following: "may" and inserting in its place the following: 'must'

SUMMARY

This amendment exempts a container of general use pesticide distributed within this State for use by a commercial agricultural producer or a certified pesticide applicator from the fee on general use pesticides. It also provides that revenues derived from the fees imposed by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, chapter 721 and Title 22, section 1471-W must be transferred from the Maine Solid Waste Management Fund in accordance with certain provisions of law.

Exempting certain commercial agricultural producers or licensed pesticide applicators from paying the proposed 20 cent fee on pesticide containers will result in a reduction of dedicated revenue to the Maine Solid Waste Management Fund in an amount that can not be determined.
