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Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any 2 nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

8 This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs. The amendment accomplishes the following.

 1. It removes the section of the bill that provided for reinstatement of "emotional disability" to the definition of
"exceptional student" in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 7001; and

2. It retains the provision in the original bill that school full implementation of 18 amends the date for the administrative unit's gifted and talented program, but changes the implementation date for gifted and talented programs from the 20 2003-2004 school year to the 2004-2005 school year. The amendment also provides that, beginning with the 2004-2005 school 22 year, a school administrative unit may request a one-year waiver from the Commissioner of Education on the requirement for fully 24 implementing its plan for phasing in its gifted and talented 26 program.
