An Act To Change Certain Educational Requirements and Make Title Changes for Licensed Social Workers

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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- Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §7001-A, sub-§8, as amended by PL 2001, c.
 4 316, §1, is further amended to read:
- 8. Licensed social worker. A "licensed social worker" is a person who has received a license as a licensed social worker from the board. In-accordance-with-the-previsions-of-section 7953;-subsection-3-A,-"licensed-secial-worker"-includes-a-person who-has-received-a-conditional--license-as-a-licensed-secial worker.

Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §7053, sub-§3, as amended by PL 2001, c. 542, 14 §1, is further amended to read:

- 3. Requirements to be a licensed social worker. On-or before-September-30,-2003,-the-board-may-issue-a-license-to-an applicant-who-meets-at-least-one-of-the-requirements-set-out-in this-subsection To be qualified to be licensed as a social worker an applicant must meet one of the following requirements:
- A. The applicant must have received a bachelor's degree in social work or social welfare from an accredited educational institution; demonstrated to the satisfaction of the board adherence to the ethics of the social worker profession; and successfully completed the examination prescribed by the board; or

B. The applicant must have received a bachelor's degree in a related field from an institution that, at the time the degree was received, did not have a program accredited by the Council on Social Work Education but subsequently offered such a program; demonstrated to the satisfaction of the board adherence to the ethics of the social worker profession; and successfully completed the examination prescribed by the board.

The board shall issue rules, in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, by which an individual who has a bachelor's degree that does not qualify under paragraph A or B may be eligible for a license.

22	This bill reverses changes made by Public Law 2001, chapter 316, which created the position of licensed bachelor social
24	worker and establish standards and educational requirements for
26	the position. The bill also has a retroactivity provision to reverse those changes to their effective date of September 21, 2001.
