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#### **SUMMARY**

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This amendment is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Labor. It provides that the Department of Labor is not authorized to finally adopt rules relating to alternative methods of payment for truck drivers and drivers helpers, as submitted to the Legislature. It requires the department to seek a legal opinion from the Attorney General, to be provided by September 1, 2003, and to report in September 2003 to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor regarding that opinion and the department's recommendations relating to the opinion. Finally, it requires the department to resubmit rules to the Second Regular Session of the 121st Legislature.
