## **SUMMARY**

This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve. It directs the Department of Environmental Protection to study the sale of batteries that contain mercury. It also directs the department to submit a report of its findings to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources matters by January 14, 2005.
