#### An Act To Authorize the Deorganization of the Town of Atkinson

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 203.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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## Sec. 1. Deorganization of Town of Atkinson. Notwithstanding any

contrary requirement of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, 4 chapter 302, if, in accordance with Title 30-A, section 7207, a 6 majority of the voters in the Town of Atkinson approve the deorganization procedure developed in accordance with Title 30-A, section 7205 and if the deorganization is approved by the voters 8 of the Town of Atkinson pursuant to section 4 of this Act, the 10 Town of Atkinson in Piscatiquis County is deorganized, except that the corporate existence, powers, duties and liabilities of the town survive for the purposes of prosecuting and defending 12 all pending suits to which the town is, or may be, a party and 14 all needful process arising out of any suits, including provisions for the payment of all or any judgments or debts that 16 may be rendered against the town or exist in favor of any creditor.

Sec. 2. Unexpended school funds. The treasurer of the Town of 20 Atkinson or any other person who has custody of the funds of the town shall pay to the Treasurer of State all unexpended school funds that, together with the credits due the town for school 22 purposes, are to be used by the State Tax Assessor to settle any school obligations contracted by the town before deorganization. 24 Any unexpended school funds remaining with the Treasurer of State after all the obligations have been met must be added to the 26 Unorganized Territory Education and Services Fund, as established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, chapter 115. 28

30 Sec. 3. Assessment of taxes. The State Tax Assessor shall assess the real and personal property taxes in the Town of 32 Atkinson as of April 1, 2005, as provided in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, chapter 115.

Sec. 4. Referendum; certificate to Secretary of State. This Act
takes effect 90 days after its approval only for the purpose of permitting its submission by the municipal officers to the legal
voters of the Town of Atkinson by ballot at the next general election to be held in November. This election must be called,
advertised and conducted according to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, sections 2528 and 2532. The town clerk shall prepare
the required ballots on which the clerk shall reduce the subject matter of this Act to the following question:

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"Do you favor the deorganization of the Town of Atkinson?"

The voters shall indicate their opinion on this question by 48 a cross or check mark placed against the word "Yes" or "No." Before becoming effective, this Act must be approved by at least 50 2/3 of the legal voters voting at the election, and the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this Act at the election must equal or exceed 50% of the total number of votes cast in the town for Governor at the last gubernatorial election.

The municipal officers of the Town of Atkinson shall declare the result of the vote. The town clerk shall file a certificate of the election result with the Secretary of State within 10 days from the date of the election.

Sec. 5. Effective date. Sections 1 to 3 of this Act take effect on July 1, 2005 if deorganization is approved by the voters of the Town of Atkinson pursuant to section 4 of this Act.

#### SUMMARY

This bill authorizes the deorganization of the Town of Atkinson if, in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 7207, a majority of the voters in the town approves the deorganization procedure developed in accordance with Title 30-A, section 7205 and if the deorganization is approved by the voters of the town at the next statewide election to be held in November.

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
