46	MAINE COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM POLICY BOARD
-10	§1531. Maine Communications System Policy Board
48	This section governs the establishment and powers of the
50	Maine Communications System Policy Board within the Department of Public Safety.
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	1. Policy board established. The Maine Communications
2	System Policy Board, referred to in this chapter as "the board,"
	is established within the Department of Public Safety, referred
4	to in this chapter as "the department." The purpose of the board
-	is to establish policies, procedures and standards for the
б	cooperative use of the department's communication systems by
8	municipal, county and state governmental entities. The board also shall carry out any other functions specified in this
0	chapter.
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	2. Members. The board consists of 15 members as follows:
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14	A. The Commissioner of Public Safety, ex officio;
14	B. The Chief of the State Police, ex officio;
16	<u>b. The chief of the blace fornee, ex officio,</u>
	C. The Chief Information Officer within the Department of
18	Administrative and Financial Services, ex officio;
20	D. A representative of the Executive Department, appointed
22	by the Governor:
22	E. A representative of participating municipalities with
24	populations of less than 5,000, selected from and
	recommended by the boards of selectmen, town councils or
26	city councils of those municipalities and appointed by the
	Governor;

30	F. A representative of participating municipalities with populations of 5,000 or more but less than 15,000, selected
50	from and recommended by the boards of selectmen, town
32	councils or city councils of those municipalities and
	appointed by the Governor;

36	populations of 15,000 or more, selected from and recommended by the boards of selectmen, town councils or city councils

	by a statewide association of county commissioners and

44	I. A representative of police chiefs of participating

	counties, recommended by a statewide association of sheriffs
50	and appointed by the Governor;

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2	K. A representative of fire chiefs of participating

6	L. A representative of emergency medical services of participating municipalities, recommended by the Emergency
8	Medical Services' Board established by Title 5, section 12004-A, subsection 15 and appointed by the Governor;
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12	M. A representative of the users of the department's communications system, appointed by the Governor. After the initial appointment, the Governor shall appoint a person who
14	serves on an advisory board established pursuant to section 1532, subsection 6 and who is recommended by a majority of
16	the members of the advisory boards;
18	N. A nonsupervisory employee of the department involved in the operation of the department's communications system,
20	recommended by the bargaining unit representing those employees and appointed by the Governor; and
22	
24	O. One citizen representing the public, who is not and has not been associated with law enforcement, fire fighting or emergency medical services, appointed by the Governor.
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28	For purposes of this subsection, "participating" means participating in the cooperative use of the department's
30	communication systems.
50	3. Term of office; vacancy. Ex officio members of the
32	board serve during their terms of office. Other members of the
	board serve 3-year terms, except that initial appointments are
34	made pursuant to subsection 4. A vacancy on the board must be
26	filled for the remainder of the unexpired term of that member in
36	the same manner as the original appointment. Members whose terms expire serve until their successors are appointed.

50	4. Initial appointments. Initial appointments to the board
40	are made as follows:
42	A. The member representing the Executive Department is appointed for a one-year term;
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	B. The member representing municipalities with populations
46	of less than 5,000 is appointed for a one-year term, the
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2	<u>C. The member representing counties is appointed for a one-year term;</u>
4	D. The member representing police chiefs is appointed for a
6	2-year term;
8	E. The member representing fire chiefs is appointed for a 3-year term;
10	F. The member representing county sheriffs is appointed for
12	a 3-year term;
14	<u>G. The member representing emergency medical services is appointed for a 2-year term;</u>
16	H. The member representing the users of the department's
18	communications system is appointed for a one-year term;
20	I. The member representing nonsupervisory employees of the department is appointed for a 2-year term; and
22	
24	<u>J. The member representing the public is appointed for a 3-year term.</u>
26	Excluding the Commissioner of Public Safety, the Chief of the
28	State Police, the Chief Information Officer within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, the member representing
30	the Executive Department and the member representing nonsupervisory employees of the department, at least 5 of the
32	<u>initial appointments must be members that represent entities in Kennebec County.</u>
34	5. Chair. The Governor shall appoint one of the 15 board members to serve as chair. The chair serves at the pleasure of
36	the Governor.
38	6. Meetings. The board may meet as necessary to carry out
40	its duties but shall meet at least one time in each calendar guarter at a place and time determined by the board and at the
	call of the chair.
42	7. Compensation. Members of the board are not entitled to
44	compensation.
46	<u>§1532. Powers and duties of board</u>
48	1. Policies, procedures and standards. The board shall
50	establish policies, procedures and standards for the cooperative use of the department's communication systems by municipal,

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<u>county and state governmental entities. The board may not</u>
 <u>establish a policy, procedure or standard that interferes with</u>
 <u>the ability of the Chief of the State Police to operate a</u>
 <u>telecommunications system pursuant to section 1508.</u>

6 2. Budget. The board shall formulate a budget for the department's communications unit, which must be submitted to the 8 commissioner for approval and inclusion in the budget of the department.

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3. Implementation plan. The board shall develop an implementation plan to accommodate the voluntary consolidation of the various governmental communications systems in Kennebec Quarty with the department's communication systems and for the design of an appropriate communications unit within the department. The plan must include provisions to ensure that employees of the department's communications unit are state employees.

20 4. Annual report. Beginning in 2005, the board shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having 22 jurisdiction over utilities and energy matters no later than February 1st of each year concerning the activities of the board 24 during the previous year and the status of the operation of the department's communication systems. The report must contain information regarding the status of the development and 26 implementation of a consolidated communications system within the 28 State. The report must also contain a list of the entities that are participants in the cooperative use of the department's communication systems. A copy of the annual report must be 30 provided to each municipality and county of the State within 10 32 days of filing the report with the Legislature.

34 5. Annual meeting. In addition to board meetings held pursuant to section 1531, subsection 6, the board shall hold an 36 annual meeting between February 15th and March 31st of each year. The purpose of the annual meeting is to solicit input from the 38 municipalities and counties of the State and other interested parties concerning the activities of the board and operation of 40 the department's communication systems.

6. Advisory boards. The board shall designate advisory boards composed of users of the department's communication
systems for the purpose of soliciting input regarding the policies, procedures and standards set by the board and the
operation of the communication systems. The board shall designate a sufficient number of advisory boards to represent the
interest of the users of the department's communication systems. Each advisory board shall make a report to the board at least one

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time in each calendar guarter at a board meeting regarding the activities of the advisory board.

#### 4 <u>§1533.</u> Supervisor of communication systems; appointment and <u>duties</u>

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Within existing resources, pending establishment of a 8 communications unit within the department, the Commissioner of Public Safety shall appoint a department employee to supervise 10 the department's communications systems and to carry out policies and procedures established by the board. Upon establishment of a communications unit in the department, the commissioner, to the 12 extent resources are available and with the approval of the board, shall appoint a director to administer the unit, plan, 14 direct and supervise the day-to-day operations of the unit and 16 carry out the policies and procedures of the board. The director may be dismissed by the commissioner for cause with the approval 18 of the board.

20 Sec. 3. Implementation report; proposed legislation. The Maine Communications System Policy Board shall report to the joint 22 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over utilities and energy matters no later than January 1, 2005 regarding the status of the implementation plan developed 24 pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 25, section 1532, 26 This report must contain information relative to subsection 3. the fiscal and personnel issues involved in the implementation of 28 consolidated communications systems. A copy of the report must be provided to each municipality and county of the State and each 30 affected bargaining unit within 10 days of filing the report with the Legislature. If during the development of the implementation 32 plan the board determines that statutory changes are required to effectuate the implementation plan, the board shall submit proposed legislation to the First Regular Session of the 122nd 34 Legislature by January 15, 2005. During the development of the implementation plan, the board shall consult with any bargaining 36 units whose members may be affected by the implementation plan. 38

#### SUMMARY

42 This amendment replaces the bill and changes the title. This amendment establishes the Maine Communications System Policy 44 Board within the Department of Public Safety. The purpose of the board is to establish policies, procedures and standards for the 46 cooperative use of the department's communication systems by municipal, county and state governmental entities. The board is 48 also directed to develop an implementation plan for the voluntary consolidation of the various governmental communication systems 50 in Kennebec County with the department's communication systems

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and for the design of an appropriate communications unit within 2 the department. The board is composed of representatives of the state and of local governments and emergency service providers who participate in the cooperative use of the department's 4 communication systems, as well as representatives of employees, users of the system and the public. The amendment also directs 6 the Commissioner of Public Safety, within existing resources, to appoint a department employee to supervise the department's 8 communications systems and to carry out policy and procedures 10 board pending established by the establishment of а communications unit within the department. Upon establishment of a communications unit in the department, the commissioner is 12 directed, to the extent resources are available and with the 14 approval of the board, to appoint a director to administer the unit, plan, direct and supervise the day-to-day operations of the 16 unit and carry out the policies and procedures of the board. The director may be dismissed by the commissioner for cause with the 18 approval of the board.
