2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17057, sub-§3** is enacted to read:

6 3. Home contact information. Records in the possession of
8 the retirement system of home addresses, home telephone numbers,
10 home facsimile transmission numbers or home e-mail addresses of
12 retirement system members, benefit recipients, staff members,
14 board members or nontrustee members of board committees are
16 confidential, are not open to public inspection and are not
18 considered public records as defined in Title 1, section 402,
20 subsection 3.

22 SUMMARY

24 This bill provides that records in the possession of the
26 Maine State Retirement System containing home contact
28 information, such as home addresses and telephone numbers, of its
30 members, benefit recipients, trustees, nontrustee members of
32 board committees and staff are confidential and not subject to
disclosure as a public record.
