The court also shall impose a fine of not less than \$1,000, none of which may be suspended.

A person who hunts or possesses a deer in violation of this section commits a Class D crime for which the 16 court shall impose a sentencing alternative of not less than 3 days for the first offense, none of which may be suspended, and 18 of not less than 10 days for each succeeding offense, none of which may be suspended. The court also shall impose a fine of 20 not less than \$1,000, none of which may suspended.

4. Moose. A person who hunts or possesses a moose in violation of this section commits a Class D crime for which the court shall impose a sentencing alternative of not less than 3 days for the first offense, none of which may be suspended, and of not less than 10 days for each succeeding offense, none of which may be suspended. The court also shall impose a fine of not less than \$1,000, none of which may be suspended.

 5. Wild turkey. A person who hunts or possesses a wild turkey in violation of this section commits a Class E crime for
 which the court shall impose a fine of not less than \$500, none of which may be suspended. The court also shall impose a fine of not less than \$500 for each wild turkey unlawfully possessed, none of which may be suspended.

 against hunting or trapping a bear after having killed one or exceeding the bag limit on bear the same as the penalty for other
 big game animals;

14 4. Clarifies that a person may not possess more than one deer in a calendar year or hunt a deer after having killed one in
