HOUSE AMENDMENT "C" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 643, L.D. 1711, Bill, "An Act To Require That a Directory Listing of a Commercial Toll-free Number Include an Address"


Amend the amendment in section 1 in that part designated "~~§1250-L.~~" in subsection 1 by inserting at the end a new blocked paragraph to read:

'Each day a violation continues constitutes a separate offense until all numbers listed in the directory or advertisement in association with the prohibited business name are disabled so that calls to the numbers do not in any way connect callers to the business.'

Further amend the amendment in section 1 in that part designated "~~§1250-L.~~" in subsection 3 in the last 2 lines (page 2, lines 15 and 16 in amendment) by striking out all of the last sentence.

**SUMMARY**

This amendment clarifies that each day that the number listed is not disabled constitutes a separate offense.
