Presented by Representative CLARK of Millinocket. Cosponsored by Senator HATCH of Somerset and Representatives: CARR of Lincoln, GOODWIN of Pembroke, SHERMAN of Hodgdon, USHER of Westbrook. Emergency preamble. Whereas. Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, continued safe, efficient and reliable rail service is essential to our State; and

8 Whereas, it has come to the attention of certain state officials that trains run by remote control are operating
10 throughout parts of the United States; and

12 Whereas, to ensure the State's public safety and the well-being of its citizens, particularly those using rail 14 service, it is essential that the issue addressed in this legislation receive prompt action; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §7308, sub-§14 is enacted to read:

14. Minimum number of employees. Each railroad company or rail authority operating within this State is required to have, at a minimum, 5 employees located on each of its trains traveling on a railroad line within this State.

32 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

38 This bill requires all trains in the State to operate with a minimum of 5 railroad company or rail authority employees.
