2 (iii) Each prospective parent who is not the biological parent of the child shall submit to having 4 fingerprints taken. The State Police, upon receipt of the fingerprint card, may charge the department for the 6 expenses incurred in processing state and national criminal history record checks. The State Police shall take or cause to be taken the applicant's fingerprints 8 and shall forward the fingerprints to the State Bureau 10 of Identification so that the bureau can conduct state and national criminal history record checks. Except 12 for the portion of the payment, if any, that constitutes the processing fee charged by the Federal 14 Bureau of Investigation, all money received by the State Police for purposes of this paragraph must be 16 paid over to the Treasurer of State. 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# COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

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Current law requires the Probate Court to request background checks, including a fingerprint-based national criminal history record check, for all adoptions once the adoption petition has been filed with the Probate Court. This amendment gives the Department of Human Services the authority to use the same basic procedure to conduct background checks earlier in the adoption process.
