## An Act To Authorize Certain School Children To Carry Asthma Inhalers on Their Persons

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §254, sub-§5, ¶C is enacted to read:

6	C. A public or approved private school shall have a written local policy authorizing students to possess and self-administer an asthma inhaler.
8	(1) The written local policy must include the
10	requirement that a student who self-administers an asthma inhaler receive written approval of the
12	student's physician and, if the student is a minor, the written approval of the student's parent or guardian
14	before receiving authorization to do so.
16	(2) The written local policy must include the requirement that the student's parent or guardian
18	submit written verification to the school from the physician confirming that the student has the knowledge
20	and the skills to safely possess and use an asthma inhaler in school.

24	SUMMARY

26 This bill requires any public or approved private school to adopt a written local policy and procedure allowing students to 28 possess and self-administer asthma inhalers in schools. The bill requires that schools receive written approval from the student's parent or quardian and the student's physician before authorizing 30 the student to self-administer an asthma inhaler. The bill also requires the student's parent or guardian to provide written 32 verification from the physician confirming that the student has the knowledge and the skills to safely possess and use an asthma 34 inhaler in a school.
