Sec. 1. Study. Resolved: That the Department of Labor and the 2 Department of Behavioral and Developmental Services, Office of Substance Abuse shall conduct a study to determine the extent of 4 drug, alcohol and substance abuse among the adult population of this State, including the workforce of this State. In conducting the study, the Department of Labor and the Office of Substance 6 Abuse shall consider existing data published by state and federal 8 agencies, including, but not limited to, the state Office of Substance Abuse and the federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health 10 Services Administration. The Department of Labor and the Office of Substance Abuse also shall consider data in state, county and 12 local police records and existing data published by community health centers, substance abuse treatment providers and employee 14 assistance providers. The Department of Labor and Office of Substance Abuse shall submit their findings to the Legislature no later than November 3, 2004. 16

SUMMARY

This resolve directs the Department of Labor and the 22 Department of Behavioral and Developmental Services, Office of Substance Abuse to conduct a study to determine the extent of 24 drug, alcohol and substance abuse among the adult population of this State, including the workforce of this State, and report 26 back to the Legislature no later than November 3, 2004.
