2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §2133, sub-§8** is enacted to read:

6 **8. Regional household hazardous waste collection.** The
8 municipal officials in each county shall work together to
10 designate an existing transfer station or recycling center in
12 each county to accept household hazardous waste for disposal by
14 residents of that county on a year-round basis. The municipal
16 officials may impose fees for the disposal of such household
18 hazardous waste.

14 SUMMARY

16 This bill requires municipal officials in each county to
18 work together to designate an existing transfer station or
20 recycling center in each county to accept household hazardous
22 waste for disposal by residents of that county on a year-round
basis. The municipal officials may impose fees for the disposal
of such household hazardous waste.
