## **SUMMARY**

10 This amendment requires the Gambling Control Board to use a central site monitoring system that, in addition to having other 12 features determined necessary by the board, has the ability to support all slot machines licensed for operation in the State, 14 including progressive slot machines, uses a widely accepted gaming industry protocol to facilitate slot machine 16 manufacturers' ability to communicate with the central site monitoring system, allows the slot machine operator to install 18 independent player tracking systems and has backup components. In selecting the central site monitoring system, the board is 20 required to select the system with the lowest overall cost that meets these requirements. If the board contracts with a 3rd 22 party to operate the central site monitoring system, that 3rd party must meet the same suitability requirements as others 24 seeking to obtain a license for gambling-related activities.
