Sec. 3. Retroactivity. This Act applies retroactively to January 1, 2004.'

SUMMARY

10 This amendment replaces the bill and changes the title. The bill brings current law into conformity with recent changes made to the federal Fair Credit Reporting Act to prevent inconsistency between state and federal law. The amendment also delays any assessment of civil penalties for a person who is not in compliance with the law until January 1, 2005.
