COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 727, L.D. 1879, Bill, "An Act To Amend the Boiler and Pressure Vessel Law"

Amend the bill in section 2 in subsection 2-A in paragraph B in the first line (page 1, line 15 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "companies" and inserting in its place the following: 'entities'

Further amend the bill in section 3 in subsection 7 in the 2nd line (page 1, line 28 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "licenses" the following: 'is'

SUMMARY

This amendment clarifies that local water districts are exempt from boiler inspection requirements in the same manner as schools and municipally owned buildings. The amendment also makes a technical correction.
