#### §2106. Working capital advance

The State Controller is authorized to advance \$300,000 from the General Fund unappropriated surplus to the <code>Division-of-PlantIndustry--program--in--the--department Certified Seed Fundestablished in section 2107</code> during any state fiscal year, if requested in writing by the Director of the Division of Plant Industry, to be used to provide cash necessary to meet current expenditures of the seed certification program. These funds must be returned to the General Fund unappropriated surplus before the close of the state fiscal year in which the advance was made. The State Controller shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs within 30 days of making any working capital advance for this purpose.

#### Sec. 7. 7 MRSA §2107 is enacted to read:

#### §2107. Certified Seed Fund

There is established the Certified Seed Fund. The fund receives all certification and inspection fees paid in accordance with section 2102 and all other funds received in support of operating a statewide seed certification program. All money deposited in the fund must be used for the management and operation of the seed certification program. Unexpended balances in the fund do not lapse and must be carried forward to be used for the purposes specified in this section. Any interest earned on the revenue deposited in the fund accrues to the fund.

Sec. 8. 10 MRSA  $\S1023$ -J, first  $\P$ , as amended by PL 2003, c. 120,  $\S3$ , is further amended to read:

The Agricultural Marketing Loan Fund, referred to in this section as the "fund," is created. The fund must be deposited with and maintained by the Finance Authority of Maine. The fund must be administered by the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and

Resources in accordance with Title 7, chapter 2 subchapter 1-D. All money received by the Finance Authority of Maine from any source for the development and implementation of an improved agricultural marketing loan program must be credited to the fund. Any money credited to the fund from the issuance of bonds on behalf of the State for financing loans for agricultural 6 enterprises may be used only for the following purposes: 8 provide assistance to agricultural enterprises in this State for the design, construction or improvement of commodity and storage 10 buildings and packing and marketing facilities; for the purchase, construction or renovation of buildings, equipment, wharves, piers or vessels used in connection with a commercial 12 agricultural enterprise; for the purchase of land in connection 14 with development of new cranberry acreage; for the purchase of land for irrigation reservoirs or to provide direct access to water for irrigation; for the purchase of land necessary for the 16 start-up of a new agricultural enterprise; for the expansion of 18 an existing agricultural enterprise when the land acquisition is necessary to comply with land use regulations; for 20 development of a business plan in accordance with the provisions of Title 7, section 436-A; for improvements to pastureland, 22 including seeding and actions to promote rotational grazing; or, if the commissioner so approves at the time of loan insurance 24 commitment, to pledge money in the fund as security for, and to apply money in the fund to, payment of principal, interest and 26 other amounts due on any term loans insured by the Finance Authority of Maine to an eligible dairy farmer. Repayment of 28 these loans and interest on these loans must be credited to the fund and may be used for the purposes stated in this section or 30 Title 7, section 436. Interest earned on money in the fund and interest earned on loans made from the fund may be used to pay 32 the administrative costs of processing loan applications, to the extent that these costs exceed the fee for administrative costs 34 established by Title 7, section 435, subsection 4.

Sec. 9. Report on Baxter State Park's reservation system. The Baxter State Park Authority shall submit a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over state parks and lands matters no later than January 2, 2006. The report must include a description of the rolling reservation system scheduled to go into effect January 1, 2005, a preliminary evaluation of the effectiveness of the rolling reservation system in fairly and efficiently allocating campsites and any modifications to the rolling reservation system that have been adopted or are being contemplated.

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Sec. 10. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

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### **SUMMARY**

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This bill is the report of the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry. It does the following.

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- 1. It establishes future report dates for agencies reviewed by the committee this session under the State Government Evaluation Act. It deletes a reference to the recently abolished State Soil and Water Conservation Commission.
- 2. It removes employees of the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources from the Pull Events Commission and

provides for the agricultural fair coordinator within the department to serve as secretary to the commission.

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- 3. It establishes a separate dedicated account to receive seed certification and inspection fees and other funds received in support of a state seed certification and inspection program.
- 8 4. It allows loans from the Agricultural Marketing Loan Fund to be used to improve pastureland.
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  5. It directs the Baxter State Park Authority to report to
  12 the joint standing committee having jurisdiction over parks and
  public lands matters in 2006 on the implementation of the rolling
  14 reservation system for Baxter State Park.
- 16 6. It adds an appropriations and allocations section.
