	SUMMARY
	This bill provides that a person who possesses both a valid ut-of-state license to harvest lobster and a wholesale seafood icense issued under Maine law may transport lobster, by vehicle
	or by boat, into the State from outside the state limits. This
E	provision applies only if the state in which the person resides provides a reciprocal transporting privilege to Maine residents and imposes minimum size restrictions on lobster that are
