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SENATE AMENDMENT 'C'' to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1422, L.D. 1921

Further amend the amendment in section 2 in that part designated "§3702." by renumbering the subsections to read consecutively.

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6 Further amend the amendment in section 2 by striking out all of that part designated "§3703." and inserting in its place the 8 following:

10 '**§3703.** Authorization for regional delivery of public education services

A school administrative unit may enter into an agreement 14 with another school administrative unit or units to form or intend to form a regional school district or regional cooperative and otherwise cooperate and participate in the development and 16 formation of a regional school district or regional cooperative 18 under this chapter. A school administrative unit may also enter into an agreement with a municipality or county to form or intend 20 to form a regional cooperative. An agreement pursuant to this section must provide that each school administrative unit combined to form a regional school district retains all its debt 22 obligations that existed on the effective date of the agreement. 24 An agreement pursuant to this section to form a regional cooperative under this chapter must specify the date for commencement of operations, subject to and following final 26 approval by the commissioner under section 3705, subsection 3.'

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At the time the commissioner issues final approval, the commissioner shall set the date designated in the agreement pursuant to section 3703 to commence operations of the regional cooperative as the date for initiation of operations by the regional cooperative.'

- <u>\$3707. Financial incentives</u>
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Regional cooperatives. Except as otherwise provided by
 section 3705, subsection 4, a regional cooperative for which the
 commissioner has issued final approval under section 3705,
 subsection 3:

34 A. Has legal authority as a fiscal entity functionally equivalent to that of a school administrative unit;

B. Is entitled to receive reimbursement from the State for385 consecutive years of an amount equal to a percentage of
the total cost of salary and benefits of one 1/4-time40equivalent regional staff member for a regional cooperative
with an aggregate resident student population of 1,500 or42more or equal to a percentage of the total cost of salary
and benefits of one 1/2-time equivalent regional staff44member for a regional cooperative with an aggregate resident
student population of 2,500 or more in accordance with the
following schedule:

(1) In the first year, 100%;

50 (2) In the 2nd year, 80%;

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2	(3) In the 3rd year, 60%;
4	(4) In the 4th year, 40%; and
6	(5) In the 5th year, 20%;
8	<u>C. Is eligible to receive assistance in the purchase of regionwide services software;</u>

- 1. Fiscal year 2004-05. In fiscal year 2004-05, \$1,000,000 of the total amount appropriated for general purpose aid for local schools; and
- 2. Fiscal year 2005-06. In fiscal year 2005-06, \$2,000,000 30 of the total amount appropriated for general purpose aid for local schools.

<u>§3725. Disbursement</u>

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 Regional cooperatives. The department shall make
 disbursements on the first day of initiation of operation from the fund to eligible regional cooperatives in amounts provided
 for and for the period specified by section 3706, subsection 1. Those amounts must be determined by the commissioner in an annual
 statement provided to the State Controller prior to disbursement.

42	2. Technical assistance. The department shall annually
	make disbursements from the fund to school administrative units
44	that have entered into agreements to form a regional school
	district or regional cooperative under section 3703 for which the
46	state board has issued preliminary certification under section
	3704, subsection 2 or preliminary approval under section 3705,
48	subsection 2, in amounts provided for in and in accordance with
	rules developed under section 3708. Those amounts must be

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determined by the commissioner in an annual statement provided to the State Controller prior to disbursement.

- 4 §3726. Uses of fund
- Public education services. Except as otherwise provided by subsections 2 and 3, the fund may be used only by a regional
 school district or regional cooperative for delivery of public education services for kindergarten to grade 12.
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2. Technical assistance. The fund may be used to contract 12 with the department or another public or private entity for technical assistance in the formation of a regional school 14 district or regional cooperative in accordance with section 3707.

16 <u>3. Other assistance for regional school district 5-year</u> plans. The fund may be used to assist one or more regional 18 <u>school districts that have received final certification under</u> section 3704, in carrying out their 5-year plans.'

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of section 3 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 3. Reporting. No later than December 1, 2004, the Department of Education, in consultation with the Executive 28 Department, State Planning Office, shall develop for presentation to and consideration by the First Regular Session of the 122nd 30 Legislature any additional proposed legislation necessary to 32 further clarify and govern the procedures for formation, governance, financing and administration and reorganization of a 34 regional school district or regional cooperative under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, chapter 123, including, but not 36 limited to, legislation regarding the procedures governing formation and selection of boards of directors, asset transfer, 38 budget development and approval, district referenda and a school administrative unit's addition to or withdrawal from a regional 40 school district or regional cooperative. Legislation developed pursuant to this section must be substantially similar to that 42 regarding school administrative districts under Title 20-A, chapter 103 and must be consistent with the intents, purposes and provisions of this Act. By January 15, 2005, the Commissioner of 44 Education shall report to the Legislature and the Governor on the efficacy of the financial incentives provided under this Act and 46 shall recommend any changes in law governing these incentives that may be needed to facilitate and encourage voluntary 48 identification and implementation of efficiencies in delivering 50 educational services. Any such recommendations made under this

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section may not propose to diminish the incentives for which a 2 regional school district or regional cooperative has been determined eligible pursuant to this Act.'

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SUMMARY

32 This amendment makes the following changes to the bill, as amended by Committee Amendment "A."

It removes provisions regarding "consulting school
 units."

38 2. It removes provisions regarding incentives and accountability components for regional school districts.

It retains provisions regarding incentives and
 accountability components for regional cooperatives. It limits the amount of funds that can be dedicated to regional
 cooperatives to 1/3 of the amount transferred to the Fund for the Efficient Delivery of Education Services in each year.

 4. It reduces transfers to the Fund for the Efficient
 48 Delivery of Education Services in fiscal year 2004-05 from .5% of general purpose aid for local schools to \$1,000,000.

5. It reduces transfers to the Fund for the Efficient Delivery of Education Services in fiscal year 2005-06 from 1.0% of general purpose aid for local schools to \$2,000,000.

 6 Efficient Delivery of Education Services specified for fiscal years 2006-07, 2007-08, 2008-09 and 2009-10.

It changes the date by which the Commissioner of
 Education must report to the Legislature from January 2007 to
 January 2005.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment reduces the Other Special Revenue Funds cost of the bill by \$2,627,053 in fiscal year 2004-05.

As amended, this bill transfers \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2004-05 and \$2,000,000 in fiscal year 2005-06 from the General Purpose Aid for Local Schools program to the Fund for the Efficient Delivery of Education Services.
