	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

F, §1, is amended to read: 44 Access to resources and records must be limited to F. authorized individuals as determined by the state agency or 46 department head, except that the powers and duties of the 48 State Auditor may not be limited by this subsection. Restrictions on access to resources depend upon the 50 vulnerability of the resource and the perceived risk of

loss, both of which must be periodically assessed. The state 2 agency or department head is responsible for maintaining accountability for the custody and use of resources and assign qualified individuals for that 4 shall purpose. Periodic comparison must be made between the resources and 6 the recorded accountability of the resources to reduce the risk of unauthorized use or loss and protect against waste and wrongful acts. The vulnerability and value of the state 8 agency or department resources determine the frequency of 10 this comparison.

12 Within each state agency or department there must be a qualified employee whose responsibility, in addition to the employee's regularly assigned duties, is to ensure that the 14 state agency or department has written documentation of its 16 internal accounting and administrative control system on The employee shall, annually, or more often as file. 18 conditions warrant, evaluate the effectiveness of the state agency's or department's internal control svstem and establish and implement changes necessary to ensure the 20 continued integrity of the system. The employee shall:

(1) Ensure that the documentation of all internal
 24 control systems is readily available for examination by the State Controller, Commissioner of Administrative
 26 and Financial Services and State Auditor;

4 All unaccounted for variances, losses, shortages or thefts of funds or property must be immediately reported to the State Controller, who shall review the matter to determine б the amount involved that must be reported to the appropriate agency or department management, law enforcement 8 state officials and the State Auditor. The State Controller shall 10 also determine the internal control weakness that contributed to or caused the condition. The State Controller 12 shall then make recommendations to the state agency or department official overseeing the internal control system 14 and other appropriate management officials. The recommendations of the State Controller must address the 16 the conditions found and the necessary correction of internal control policies and procedures that must be modified. The state agency or department oversight official 18 and the appropriate management officials shall immediately 20 implement policies and procedures necessary to prevent a recurrence of the problems identified and report the steps 22 taken to the State Controller. From time to time the State Controller shall examine the policies and procedures 24 implemented to ensure that the relevant policies and procedures are functioning appropriately. 26

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Sec. 4. Revision clause. Wherever in the Maine Revised Statutes the words "Bureau of Accounts and Control" appear or reference is made to that bureau within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, those words are amended to read or mean, as the case may be, "Office of the State Controller," and the Revisor of Statutes shall implement this revision when updating, publishing or republishing the statutes. 34

## **SUMMARY**

38 This bill implements the recommendations of the committee regarding the State Government Evaluation Act. It amends the 40 State Government Evaluation Act by setting new dates for agency reviews. The bill also requires a designated agency employee to 42 notify the State Controller immediately when a nonstate entity requests access to agency accounting records. It also changes 44 the name of the Department of Administration and Financial Services, Bureau of Accounts and Control to Office of the State 46 Controller.
