26	'Sec. 2. Director of Bureau of Parks and Lands authorized to convey certain real estate to First Roach Pond Leaseholders Coalition. Resolved:				
28	That the Director of the Bureau of Parks and Lands within the				
30	Department of Conservation may by quitclaim deed convey without covenants, for appraised fair market value and for private uses,				
32	and on such terms and conditions as the director may direct, to the First Roach Pond Leaseholders Coalition, or its individual				
34	members and assigns, certain lots or parcels of land situated in Township A, Range 13 WELS, Frenchtown, Piscataquis County, State of Maine, which land is part of the public lot in said township				
36	as first described in the petition for partition and report of partition commissioners dated December 11, 1948 and recorded in				
38	the Piscataquis County Registry of Deeds in Book 20, Page 1, said lots being located northerly of the South Inlet Road, also				
40	presently known as the Frenchtown Road, and between said road and the southerly shore of First Roach Pond, which parcels of land				
42	must be further identified and described by and through the performing of an instrument survey prior to said conveyance to be				
44	commissioned by the director. The conveyance excepts and reserves to the State the so-called South Inlet Campground, being

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A' to S.P. 775, L.D. 1942

In the event that the portion of the Frenchtown Road 2 maintained by Piscataquis County is discontinued as a county road, the director shall take any reasonable action that resources allow to ensure continuing full public rights-of-way 4 over the road; and be it further' 6 Further amend the resolve by striking out all of section 4. 8 Further amend the resolve by relettering or renumbering any 10 nonconsecutive Part section letter or number to read consecutively. 12 14 SUMMARY 16 This amendment replaces that section of the resolve that authorizes conveyance of certain lots on First Roach Pond with revised language to correct the name of the association of 18 leaseholders, better describe and identify the lots and allow the 20 transfer to either the First Roach Pond Leaseholders Coalition or its individual members. It directs the Director of the Bureau of Parks and Lands within the Department of Conservation to take 22 action to ensure continuing public access to the campground lot retained by the State if that portion of the Frenchtown Road used 24 to access the campground is discontinued as a county road. 26 The amendment also removes section 4 from the resolve, which 28 proposed authorizing conveying land in Skowhegan known as the Yankee Woodlot to the Somerset County Commissioners. 30 **FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED** 32 (See attached)
