training to be reviewed and the type of information to be updated. The rule must require that the trainer document that the unlicensed school personnel have attended the appropriate continuing education sessions and have demonstrated competency in medication administration.

The rule must be amended to require that the initial training provided to unlicensed school personnel who are authorized to administer medication to students must inform school personnel of the liabilities for both the individual dispensing medication and the individual monitoring the dispensing of medications in school.'

This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs. The amendment provides that the legislative review of Chapter 40: Medication Administration in Maine Schools, a major substantive rule of the Department of Education, is authorized only if the rule is amended to insert additional conditions to the required local school policy, training and authorization for the administration of medication by unlicensed school personnel in school settings.
