COMMITTEE AMENDMENT 'T' to S.P. 17, L.D. 37

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Sec. 1. Department of Health and Human Services to seek federal 2 funding to serve immigrant and refugee populations in need of mental health and substance abuse treatment. Resolved: That the Department 4 of Health and Human Services shall seek funding from the federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration in 6 order to provide substance abuse and mental health treatment programs for immigrant or refugee persons residing in the State. If a federal grant is received for this purpose, the department 8 may use the funding for development and operation of one or more 10 programs on a statewide basis to serve immigrant or refugee persons who are in need of substance abuse or mental health treatment services in accordance with any federal restrictions or 12 conditions placed upon the receipt of the funding; and be it 14 further

16 Sec. 2. Reporting date established. Resolved: That, by November 15, 2005, the Department of Health and Human Services shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services and the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and 20 Financial Affairs. The report is not limited to but must address:

22 1. The progress the department has made in securing the federal funding identified in section 1 of this resolve;

 If funds have been received, the progress the department
has made in developing the programs authorized in section 1 of this resolve;

The staff development and training efforts involved with
the programs;

4. The location or locations of the programs; and

34 5. The number of immigrant or refugee persons served to date.
