2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA c. 429-B is enacted to read:

6 CHAPTER 429-B

8 TUITION WAIVER AT STATE POSTSECONDARY  
10 EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS FOR STUDENTS ACHIEVING  
12 LEARNING RESULTS STANDARDS

14 §12581. Definitions

16 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise  
18 indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

20 1. Authority. "Authority" means the Finance Authority of  
22 Maine.

24 2. Eligible student. "Eligible student" means a Maine  
26 resident who is a Maine high school graduate who has satisfied  
28 learning results standards pursuant to section 6209 and will be  
30 entering that person's first year in a state postsecondary  
32 educational institution.

34 3. State postsecondary educational institution. "State  
36 postsecondary educational institution" means the University of  
38 Maine System, Maine Maritime Academy and the Maine Community  
40 College System.

42 §12582. Tuition waiver

44 Eligible students may attend the first year of any state  
46 postsecondary educational institution free of tuition charges.

48 §12583. Administration

50 1. Application. A person may apply to the authority for  
determination of eligibility under this chapter on forms and in a  
manner prescribed by rule of the authority. Rules adopted  
pursuant to this chapter are routine technical rules as defined  
in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

2. Decision. The authority shall determine whether an  
applicant is eligible and notify the applicant. The authority  
shall also notify the state postsecondary educational institution  
at which the person is accepted of the eligibility of that person  
for a tuition waiver. Unless notified by the authority of a  
change in the student's eligibility, the institution may not bill  
an eligible student for tuition during that student's first  
academic year.
