COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 73, L.D. 77, Bill, "An Act To Require Valid Identification for All Purchases of Liquor"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act To Require Valid Identification for Purchases of Liquor'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 1 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 28-A MRSA §706, sub-§2 is enacted to read:

2. Age requirement for identification. A licensee or licensee's employee or agent may not sell, furnish, give or deliver liquor or imitation liquor to a person under 27 years of age unless the licensee or licensee's employee or agent verifies the person is not a minor by means of reliable photographic identification containing that person's date of birth.'

SUMMARY

This amendment is the majority report and replaces the language of the bill. The amendment prohibits a licensee or licensee's employee or agent from selling, furnishing, giving or delivering liquor or imitation liquor to a person under 27 years of age unless that person provides a reliable photographic identification showing that person is not a minor.
