	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:			
2	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA c. 318 is enacted to read:

6	AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMS			
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10	§8901. After-school programs; standards; approval			
12	The after-school program is established to encourage the facilitation of high-quality after-school programs in school administrative units throughout the State. The commissioner			
14	shall administer the program within the department. Standards and approval for after-school programs are as follows.			
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18	1. Standards. The state board and the commissioner shall jointly adopt rules to establish standards consistent with basic school approval requirements for after-school programs offered at			
20	elementary or secondary schools in the State.			
22	2. Approval. An after-school program may be offered by any			
24	school administrative unit with the approval of the commissioner. The commissioner may inspect any after-school program, after which the commissioner may approve and grant a			
26	certificate to a school that maintains approval standards. The expense of inspection must be paid by the department.

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§8904. Eligibility

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4. State administration. The commissioner shall add to the funding level an amount sufficient to provide for the administration of this section.

<u>§8906. Report</u>

The department shall report by June 30, 2006 and annually 8 thereafter to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and cultural affairs on the 10 number of participants in the program, the nature of the after-school programs receiving funds, the amount of funds 12 distributed and the number of children participating in the program.

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<u>§8907. Rules</u>

The commissioner shall adopt rules for the implementation and administration of the after-school program, including the establishment of program requirements and specifications and procedures for the application and distribution of available funds, and to otherwise carry out the purpose of this program. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined by Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

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Sec. 2. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

28 EDUCATION, DEPARTMENT OF

30 After-school Program

32 Initiative: Provides funds for the facilitation of after-school programs. The appropriation is based on after-school programs 34 receiving an amount equal to 0.5% of the annual General Fund appropriations for kindergarten to grade 12 public education.

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SUMMARY

This bill establishes the after-school program as an ongoing 46 program to be implemented and administered by the Department of Education. This bill also requires the ongoing funding for the

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after-school program to be equal to 0.5% of the annual General 2 Fund appropriation for kindergarten to grade 12 public education.

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
