COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 110, L.D. 132

SUMMARY

4 This is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee Transportation. This amendment requires on publicly and privately employed flaggers to receive annual training in б controlling traffic at construction sites. The amendment clarifies that flagger training must comply with the standards 8 set forth in the latest edition of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways. This amendment 10 requires flagger training materials to be paid for by the Department of Transportation. This amendment also provides that 12 flagger training requirements do not apply to an individual 14 providing flagging services in an emergency situation where there is imminent danger of damage or injury to property or personal health and safety. 16
