RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine To Require a 2/3 Vote of the Legislature To Enact or Increase a Tax

	date. Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall
40	notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and
	plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding
42	a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of
44	this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment

	"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to require

exemptions except when inadequate funds have been appropriated for debt payment?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the Constitution of Maine on the date of the proclamation; and be it further

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

SUMMARY

This constitutional resolution requires approval of 2/3 of each House of the Legislature to enact or increase taxes or to repeal existing tax exemptions except when inadequate funds have been appropriated for debt payment.
