	As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

	2. Eligible student. "Eligible student" means a student of
	the Maine School of Science and Mathematics who graduated among
	the top 10% of the student's graduating class as determined by
	the authority and who will be attending a state postsecondary
	educational institution.
	3. State postsecondary educational institution. "State
	postsecondary educational institution" means the University of
	Maine System, the Maine Maritime Academy and the Maine Community
	College System.
1	§12592. Tuition waiver

	Eligible students may attend a state postsecondary
-	educational institution free of tuition charges.
	§12593. Administration
	1. Application. A person may apply to the authority for
	determination of eligibility under this chapter on forms and in a
	manner prescribed by rule of the authority. Rules adopted
	pursuant to this chapter are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
	IN TICLE A, CHapter 3/3, subchapter 2-8.
	2. Decision. The authority shall determine whether an
	applicant is eligible and notify the applicant. The authority
	shall also notify the state postsecondary educational institution
	at which the person is accepted of the eligibility of that person for a tuition waiver. Unless notified by the authority of a
	change in the student's eligibility, the institution may not bill
	an eligible student for tuition during that student's enrollment.
