Renewals 8 Registration under this chapter is valid for 2 years and 10 expires at a time the commissioner designates. A registration may be renewed up to 90 calendar days after the date of its 12 expiration upon payment of a late fee in addition to the renewal fee. Any registrant who submits an application for renewal more 14 than 90 calendar days after the expiration date is subject to all requirements governing new registrations under this chapter. 16 §15306. Denial or suspension of registration or renewal 18 The office may refuse to accept a registration under this 20 chapter, suspend a registration or deny an application for renewal if: 22 1. Incomplete. The registration or renewal is incomplete 24 or is not accompanied by the required fee; 26 2. False representation. The registrant makes a false or fraudulent material representation in connection with its 28 registration, renewal or any records or reports kept or filed relating to Internet auction listing services; 30 3. Certain crimes. The registrant is convicted of a felony 32 or a crime of which an essential element is dishonesty, fraud, larceny, embezzlement or obtaining money, property or credit by 34 false pretenses; 36 4. Discipline in other jurisdiction. The registrant has been subject to discipline by another state, the United States, a 38 foreign nation or another governmental agency and at least one of the grounds for discipline is the same or equivalent to the 40 grounds described in this section; 42 5. Records unavailable. The registrant fails to reasonably make available to the office relevant records and documents relating to its Internet auction listing services upon request; or 44 46 6. Failure to provide information. The registrant fails to provide information to the office in response to a written 48 request within 30 days of the request. §15307. Rules 50
