22	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the emergency preamble and before the summary and inserting in its
24	place the following:
26	'Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA c. 206, sub-c. 5 is enacted to read:

32	<u>§5250-Q. Pine Tree Recreation Zone</u>
34	1. Definitions. As used in this subchapter, unless the
36	<u>context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the</u> <u>following meanings.</u>
38	A. "Qualified project" means a business project that meets
40	<u>the criteria set forth in subsection 4 conducted by a gualified industry.</u>
42	B. "Qualified industry" means a for-profit corporation, limited liability company, partnership, registered limited
44	liability partnership, sole proprietorship, business trust
46	or any other entity, inside or outside the State, that is engaged in or will engage in a qualified project.

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2	2. Establishment. The Pine Tree Recreation Zone is established to expand recreational opportunities and encourage
4 [′]	tourism and economic development in areas adjacent to and located within the State's natural resources in the central and northern
6	regions of the State.
8	3. Designation of zone. The Pine Tree Recreation Zone is that area of the State that is north and east of the Androscoggin
10	<u>River.</u>
12	4. Project eligibility. A business project is eligible to gualify for Pine Tree Recreation Zone benefits if the project:
14	A. Is located within the Pine Tree Recreation Zone and is
16	in a labor market area with a population density of less than 30 people per square mile according to the last Federal
18	Decennial Census; and
20	B. Derives at least 50% of its business from sustainable recreational or agricultural tourism activities that involve
22	the use of available natural resources and provides at least
24	one of the following services:
26	(1) Accommodations;
28	(2) Guiding or instructional services; and
30	(3) The sale or rental of equipment for use in canoeing, kayaking, hunting, fishing, sailing,
	whitewater rafting, hiking, wildlife photography,
32	<u>snowmobiling, dog sledding, snowshoeing, downhill or</u> cross-country skiing, camping activities or other
34	similar nature-based tourism activities.
36	5. Administration; rules. The Commissioner of Economic and Community Development shall administer this subchapter and shall
38	adopt rules for the implementation of this subchapter. Rules
40	adopted under this subsection are major substantive rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A. The
42	commissioner is authorized to adopt rules setting forth the process by which qualified projects may apply for funding from
	grants and loans, including loans administered by the Finance
44	Authority of Maine through its economic recovery loan program.
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	Sec. 2. Development of strategic plan. The Department of Economic and Community Development shall convene at least 4

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associations to gather information on the most effective methods

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for attracting, retaining and developing natural resource-based industries and nature-based tourism in central and northern 2 Maine, as well as to structure the eligibility criteria and 4 benefit structure for Pine Tree Recreation Zone program participants and qualified projects. The Department of Economic and Community Development shall include in these meetings the 6 Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, the 8 Department of Conservation, the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, the Department of Environmental Protection, the Department of Marine Resources and statewide associations that 10 have an interest in nature-based tourism in central and northern 12 Maine and in farming and agricultural tourism. The Commissioner of Economic and Community Development shall use this information 14 to develop a strategic plan for attracting, retaining and expanding new and existing natural resource-based industries and 16 nature-based tourism in central and northern Maine that must include a proposal for program benefits using loans and state 18 grant programs. The commissioner shall report by February 15, 2007 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having 20 jurisdiction over business, research and economic development matters on the details of this strategic plan for the Pine Tree 22 Recreation Zone. The joint standing committee of the Legislature jurisdiction over business, research and economic having 24 development matters is authorized to report out legislation on the strategic plan to the First Regular Session of the 123rd 26 Legislature.

28 Sec. 3. Effective date. That section of this Act that enacts the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, chapter 206, subchapter 5 30 takes effect January 1, 2008.

32 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved, unless otherwise indicated.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill and establishes the Pine 40 Tree Recreation Zone as that area of the State north and east of the Androscoggin River. It defines "qualified industry" as any for-profit corporation, limited liability company, partnership, 42 registered limited liability partnership, sole proprietorship, 44 business trust or any other entity, inside or outside the State, that is engaged in or will engage in a qualified Pine Tree 46 Recreation Zone project. To be eligible as a qualified project, a business project must be located within the Pine Tree 48 Recreation Zone and be in a labor market area with a population density of less than 30 people per square mile, according to the 50 last Federal Decennial Census, and must derive at least 50% of its business from sustainable recreational or agricultural

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tourism activities that involve the use of available natural 2 resources and provide accommodations, guiding or instructional services or the sale or rental of equipment for use in canoeing, 4 kayaking, hunting, fishing, sailing, whitewater rafting, hiking, wildlife photography, snowmobiling, dog sledding, snowshoeing, б downhill or cross-country skiing, camping activities or other similar nature-based tourism activities. The amendment authorizes the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development 8 to adopt major substantive rules and establishes an effective 10 date of January 1, 2008 for the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, chapter 206, subchapter 5.

This amendment requires the Department of Economic and Community Development, to convene meetings with representatives 14 of departments and stakeholder associations to gather information on the most effective methods of attracting, retaining and 16 developing natural resource-based industries and nature-based tourism in central and northern Maine and to structure the 18 eligibility criteria and benefits that will be provided to qualified projects. It requires the Commissioner of Economic and 20 Community Development to use this information to develop a strategic plan for attracting, retaining and expanding new and 22 existing natural resource-based industries and nature-based 24 tourism in central and northern Maine that must include a proposal for program benefits using loans and state grant 26 programs. It also requires the commissioner to report by February 15, 2007 to the joint standing committee of the 28 Legislature having jurisdiction over business, research and economic development matters on the details of this strategic plan for the Pine Tree Recreation Zone. It also authorizes the 30 joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction 32 over business, research and economic development matters to report out legislation on this issue to the First Regular Session of the 123rd Legislature. 34
