Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §851, sub-§2, ¶A, as amended by PL 1995, c.
4 638, §3, is further amended to read:

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A. Causing or aiding another to commit or engage in
prostitution, ~~other than as a patron;~~

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SUMMARY

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Current law provides that a person promotes prostitution
if, among other things, the person causes or aids another to
14 commit or engage in prostitution, other than as a patron. This
bill removes the phrase "other than as a patron."

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
