An Act To Restrict Placement of Political Signs

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §1913-A, sub-§1, ¶H, as amended by PL 1999, c.
4	152, Pt. G, $\S2$ , is further amended to read:
6	H. Signs bearing political messages relating to an election, primary or referendum,-provided-that-these, These
8	signs may not be placed within the right-of-way prior to 6 weeks before the election, primary or referendum to which
10	they relate and must be removed by the candidate or political committee not later than one week thereafter. A
12	political sign must be placed at least 3 feet from the paved surface of the public way and must be placed with permission
14	of the landowner of the nearest property abutting the right-of-way; and
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18	SUMMARY
20	This bill restricts the placement of political signs to at least 3 feet from the paved surface of public ways and requires
22	receiving permission from abutting landowners.

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
