SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 174, L.D. 235

SUMMARY

6 This amendment provides that starting October 1, 2006, the minimum hourly wage for a person who has not attained 18 years of age and who is regularly enrolled in an educational institution or is on vacation from an educational institution is \$6.50 per 10 hour. An employer may pay an employee this reduced minimum hourly wage for no longer than 60 days. This reduced minimum 12 hourly wage applies only to an employer with 25 or fewer employees.
