## An Act To Limit Terms for Members of the State Board of Education

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §401, sub-§4, as amended by PL 1987, c. 851,
4	§4, is further amended to read:
6	4. Term. The term of office of each member shall-be is 5
8	years. Any-vacancy-shall <u>A person may not serve more than any 2</u> <u>5-year terms. A vacancy must</u> be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term. The state board shall promulgate rules in
10	accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, which establishes the procedure and criteria by
12	which the state board may recommend to the Governor the removal
14	of a member from office prior to completion of the term of appointment for failure to perform the duties of office.
16	Sec. 2. Application. This Act applies with the beginning of the new appointments by the Governor at the expiration of the
18	current board members' terms of office.
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22	SUMMARY
24	This bill limits the number of terms of office for members of the State Board of Education to 2 5-year terms, which need not
26	be consecutive, beginning with new appointments by the Governor at the expiration of the current board members' terms of office.

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
