	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §7303-A, as enacted by PL 2001, c. 106,
4	§1, is repealed.
6	Sec. 2. 35-A MRSA §7303-B is enacted to read:
8	<u>§7303-B. Basic service calling areas</u>
10	No later than January 1, 2006, the commission shall by rule ensure that an eligible local exchange carrier offers its
12	customers a flat-rate-unlimited-calling area option that includes calls made to persons located in contiguous exchanges and in
14	abutting municipalities. For the purposes of this section, the commission shall by rule define "contiguous exchanges."

18	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.

22	A. "Abutting municipalities" means all municipalities that share a common boundary with the municipality in which the
24	calling customer receives telephone service.
	B. "Eligible local exchange carrier" means a local exchange
26	<u>carrier designated by the commission pursuant to 47 United</u> States Code, Section 214(e) as an eligible
28	telecommunications carrier for the purposes of receiving
	universal service funding pursuant to 47 United States Code,
30	Section 254.
32	2. Commission authority. Nothing in this section limits
34	the commission's authority to expand or modify basic service
34	calling areas consistent with the requirements of this section or to require a local exchange carrier that is not an eligible local
36	exchange carrier to offer flat-rate-unlimited-calling area options.

40	3. Cost recovery. The commission may allow an eligible local exchange carrier affected by the expansion of a flat-rate-unlimited-calling area to recover, to the extent
42	reasonable, its costs, including lost revenues, attributable to the expansion.
44	4. Rules. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are
46	routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
