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38	SUMMARY
40	This bill repeals language requiring the State Planning Office to report annually to the Legislature on statewide storage
42	inventory of petroleum products and expands the State Planning Office's duty to report on projected shortfalls to include
44	projected shortfalls of kerosene. This bill also repeals the section of law establishing the State's petroleum set-aside
46	system.

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
