This bill establishes a fee of up to \$350 for a general permit for industrial stormwater discharges issued pursuant to
the waste discharge laws. The general permit fee currently in statute is to be used for other types of general permits under
the waste discharge laws.

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14 The bill also authorizes disbursements from the Ground Water Oil Clean-up Fund to pay costs incurred by the Department of 16 Environmental Protection to monitor and regulate air emissions from the distribution and use of oil.
