**RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of** Maine To Allow the Legislature To Authorize Municipalities To Adopt a Property Tax Assistance Program That Reflects a Claimant's Ability To Pay

Reported by Representative WOODBURY of Yarmouth for the Joint Select Committee on Property Tax Reform pursuant to Joint Order 2005, H.P. 108.

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MILLICENT M. MacFARLAND Clerk Constitutional amendment. Resolved: Two thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:

#### Constitution, Art. IX. §8, sub-§6 is enacted to read:

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6. Municipal refunds of property taxes. The Legislature
 may authorize municipalities to refund a portion of the property taxes, or rent constituting property taxes, paid on property that
 is the principal residence of the claimant. The refund must be calculated to reflect the ability of the claimant to pay the tax
 or rent constituting property tax.

; and be it further

16 Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding 20 a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question: 24

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to allow the Legislature to authorize municipalities to refund a portion of the property taxes, or rent constituting property taxes, paid on a principal residence, with the refund based upon the resident's ability to pay?"

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The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a 32 cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, 34 counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as 36 votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes 38 are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the 40 Constitution of Maine on the date of the proclamation; and be it further 42

44 Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the
 Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town
 46 and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution
 necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

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#### SUMMARY

2 This resolution proposes to amend the Constitution of Maine 4 to allow the Legislature to authorize municipalities to adopt a property tax assistance program that reflects the resident's 6 ability to pay.
