Be it enacted by the reopie of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2013 is enacted to read:
§2013. Waiting period for certain firearms sales
or transfers
A person may not sell or transfer a firearm without a 10-da
waiting period to any person who has not attained 22 years o
age. For the purpose of this section, "firearm" has the same
meaning as in Title 17-A, section 2, subsection 12-A.
SUMMARY
This bill requires a 10-day waiting period before a firear
may be sold or transferred to any person who has not attained 23
years of age.
