following: " 0.5% " and inserting in its place the following: ' 1% '
Further amend the bill in section 1 in paragraph C in subparagraph (2) in the 3rd line (page 1, line 15 in L.D.) by
striking out the following: "the most current" and inserting in its place the following: 'at least one'
Further amend the bill in section 1 in paragraph C in
subparagraph (2) in the last line (page 1, line 17 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "State" the following: 'in either
of the 2 preceding elections'
SUMMARY
This amendment raises the percentage of registered voters a political party would need to have enrolled in order to achieve
qualified party status from 0.5%, as proposed in the bill, to 1% according to at least one tabulation of registered voters in
either of the 2 preceding elections.

The amounts will depend on the additional number of political parties that may become recognized and can not be determined at this time.
