COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 279, L.D. 377, "RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine To Establish Health Care as a Right"

Amend the resolution in that part designated "Section 6-B." in the last line (page 1, line 9 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "health" the following: 'subject to the decisions of the Legislature regarding the proper access to that right'

Further amend the resolution in the question in the last line (page 1, line 24 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "right" the following: 'subject to the decisions of the Legislature regarding the proper access to that right'

SUMMARY

This amendment adds to the constitutional amendment the requirement that the Legislature determine what the access to the right to health care should be.
