	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §1002, sub-§8, ¶B, as enacted by PL 2003, c.
4	652, Pt. B, §5 and affected by §8, is amended to read:
6	B. A dealer must obtain a written permit from the Secretary of State to operate a vehicle or combination of vehicles
8	carrying a load. The permit must be issued in accordance with the following provisions.

12	(1) The operation of the vehicle or combination of vehicles and load must be in conjunction with the sale or purchase of a motor vehicle, vehicle or equipment by
14	the dealer.
16	(2) The load must consist of a motor vehicle, trailer or equipment that the dealer is licensed to sell.
18	
20	(3) The load may not consist of more than ene automobiles, trucks or truck tracted tractors at any time.

24	(4) The initial fee and renewal fee for a permit issued under this paragraph are \$200 each.
26	(5) A permit expires one year from the date of issuance and may be renewed annually.

	(6) A permit must contain the name and address of the
30	licensed dealer, an effective date, an expiration date and any other information required by the Secretary of
