**Resolve, To Require the Department of Health and Human Services To Amend Rules Regarding Licensing of Intermediate Care Facilities for Mental Retardation Nursing**

Whereas,** acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, immediate relief from regulatory burdens is necessary; and

8 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 10 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 12 safety; now, therefore, be it

14 Sec. 1. Adopt rules. Resolved: That by July 1, 2005, the Department of Health and Human Services shall amend the rules 16 regarding licensing of intermediate care facilities for mental retardation nursing to allow for the elimination of a state 18 survey of facilities. The Department of Health and Human Services shall notify the Joint Standing Committee on Health and 20 Human Services of any rule that is amended pursuant to this resolve. The rules to be amended are major substantive rules as 22 defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

24 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

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## SUMMARY

30 This resolve requires the Department of Health and Human Services, Bureau of Medical Services, Division of Licensing and 32 Certification to amend the major substantive rules regarding the granting of licenses to all intermediate care facilities for 34 mental retardation nursing that are approved for Medicaid certification of eligibility.
